




Why is it so important to remember the past?



Vocabulary	
Nazi	A member of the political group led by Adolf Hitler that ruled Germany from 1933 to 1945.
Allies	The group of countries fighting against Germany during WWII.
Axis	The group of countries led by Germany in WWII.
Luftwaffe	The German air force during WWII.
Holocaust	The murder of millions of people (mainly Jews) by the Nazis. Nazi's built concentration camps to prevent certain demographics from being part of the war.
Genocide	Trying to murder a whole group of people.







Contributing factors to WWII 1918 Germany lost WWI. 1929 The 'Great Depression'. 1933 Hitler became chancellor. 1939 Hitler invaded Poland.

Sticky Knowledge

On **September 1st 1939**, Hitler invaded **Poland**. 2 days later, **France** and **Britain** declared war on Germany, beginning WWII.

The **Battle of Britain** was a major air campaign fought between RAF (Britain) and the Luftwaffe (Germany).

The **Blitz** happened from September 1940 to May 1941. It was a sustained bombing campaign carried out on British cities, towns and ports to destroy factories and prevent trade leaving the UK.

Evacuation was the movement of women, infants and children from cities to the countryside to keep them safe from bombing.

The 'home front' describes activities of British people at home during the war: Air Raid wardens, growing vegetables and making gas masks and weaponry.

Traditional **women's roles** were revolutionised during the war because they were needed to complete jobs that men would have done if it wasn't for the war.

Nottingham Blitz was in 1941 and Rolls Royce were targeted. Nottingham was the first city to develop **ARP** (air raid precautions), reducing damage to the city.

Germany surrendered in May 1945.

WWII had a **national impact**: NHS, rationing, homelessness and poor health.
